CHC50121 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care

Course Description

This qualification reflects the role of educators in early childhood education and care who work in regulated children's education and care services in Australia. Educators at this level are responsible for designing and implementing curriculum that meets the requirements of an approved learning framework and for maintaining compliance in other areas of service operations. They use specialised knowledge and analyse and apply theoretical concepts to diverse work situations. They may have responsibility for supervision of volunteers or other educators.

Entry Requirements

Entry to this qualification is open to individuals who hold a:

- CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childcare Education and Care; or
- CHC30113 Certificate III in Early Childcare Education and Care.

It is expected that the student would possess reading, writing, numeracy and literacy skills to enable them to complete the qualification at the AQF level.

They are also expected to have sound computer skills to enable them to undertake the course.

Students must have access to a Children's education and care service in Australia that offers the full range of services required to complete their study to conduct their work placement.

They must also either hold or be eligible to obtain a Blue Card (Qld) or similar approval in other states to work in an approved children's education and care service in Australia.

Course delivery

The qualification is delivered through the following:

- Online over a maximum of 12 months. Intakes are rolling.
- RPL over a maximum of 6 months (with gap training if required).

RPL is only offered to existing workers with current experience equivalent to 2 years or more working in the childcare industry.

Students are advised of the training and assessment requirements by their trainer/assessor prior to commencement.

Work Placement

The student will be required to complete a minimum of 280 hours practical placement in a regulated education and care service in Australia that offers the full range of services required to complete your study. It is ultimately the student's obligation to find practical placement in their field of study. Most students will already be working in the industry, however if you are not working and experiencing difficulty, the Institute can assist. Call us to discuss.

Recognition of Prior Learning

RPL is "the acknowledgement of the skills and knowledge" that you have already gained through previous work, studies, and life experiences that relate to this qualification. If you are granted recognition in a unit/s of competency, you do not have to re-study that unit. If you think you may be eligible to apply for RPL because of your previous work, study and life experiences, please contact the Institute to access your RPL kit.

QUEENSLAND GOVERNMENT CAREER BOOST PROGRAM – GENERAL TRAINING PATHWAY - ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To access a subsidised training place under Career Boost, a student must meet the following criteria:

- aged 15 years or older;
- not be a school student;
- permanently reside in Queensland;
- be an Australian citizen, or Australian permanent resident (includes humanitarian entrant), or a temporary resident with the right visa and work permits on the pathway to permanent residency, or a New Zealand citizen;
- not already have a Certificate IV or higher qualification completed within the last 10 years (qualifications completed as a school student and foundation skills qualifications do not count);
- not exceed a maximum of two (2) government-funded apprenticeships/traineeships within a 10-year period.
- not be enrolled in another qualification, even if it is on hold or deferred, whether funded by DTET or not (foundation skills qualifications do not count).

Concessional students undertaking vocational qualifications, including those who:

- hold a Health Care, Veteran, or Pensioner Concession Card, or are the partner or dependent of someone with such a card and are named on the card;
- have a Commonwealth form confirming eligibility for concessions under a Health Care, Veteran, or Pensioner Concession Card; for themselves, their partner or person of whom they are a dependant
- identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander (First Nations people);
- have a disability;
- is an adult prisoner;

(Please Note: Co-Contributions Fee will be discounted if a successful Credit Transfer can be applied for past study. The discount applied will be at \$2 per unit of competency for students paying the Non-Concessional Co-Contributions fee and \$1 for students paying the Concessional Co-Contributions fee.)
